## The Lakeland rowing story

ntil 2007, when Lakeland RC was set up by a small group of rowers in retirement, there were no rowing clubs between Brampton and Lancaster, an area of several hundred square miles including some of the most beautiful stretches of water in the Lake District.

By 2016, there were enough members to split into two independent clubs: Lakeland on Derwentwater and, for those in the south of the county, Windermere RC.

Lakeland gained charitable status in 2017. A year later, having outgrown a temporary home at Derwent Water Marina, we became tenants of the National Trust on Keswick Isthmus, where we built ourselves a new base.

The club now has around 100 members, who attend evening and weekend sessions or form crews for impromptu weekday outings. We row all year round, wind permitting, and experienced visitors are always welcome.

Members mostly scull in singles, doubles and quads (boats for four people), with occasional rowing, with one blade each, in pairs, fours or an eight.

Between April and September, our qualified coaches run low-cost adult and junior learn-to-row courses, with bursaries available to help with fees.
